It's been almost two months since the election and most are still digesting the results. The choice was clear and people worked hard to elect a prolife president. Livingston County voters, in a sea of red, were overwhelmingly prolife 55% vs. 42%. Unfortunately, voters statewide did the reverse with 57% supporting Obama vs. 41% for McCain.

In defense of the tiniest of humans, many organizations came together, against huge odds, to defeat Proposal 2. Statewide, thousands of individuals volunteered and donated sacrificially. In spite of this effort, Michigan voters chose to allow unrestricted research on human embryos by a small margin.

Even though president-elect Obama has been given his orders from those who advocate abortion (see article on page 6), the consequences of electing a pro-abortion president remain to be seen.

We've heard the saying that it's always darkest just before the dawn. Examine our society and it is evident that the beacon of hope, the United States once represented, seems to be dimming. In addition to economic difficulties and no confidence in our elected officials the gulf that separates the prolife community from those who worship choice is just deepening.

Yet the smallest bit of light is all that's needed to dispel the darkness of a whole room. So we will continue to do what we do and shine the light of truth into the murky world of abortion, infanticide, assisted suicide and now, in our state, unrestricted research on human embryos.

As a newcomer, compared to some of our other board members, my

experience in defense of the unborn is somewhat limited. Except as an occasional volunteer during election cycles, my commitment to the prolife movement only reaches back 12 years.

What is evident to me is that the approach to end abortion, as an affiliate of Right to Life of Michigan, has worked to save lives. Parental consent, informed consent, a ban on Medicaid funding of abortion, the ultrasound viewing option, clinic regulations, born alive infant protection, "safe delivery" for newborns, the ban on assisted suicide, umbilical cord blood legislation, organ harvesting ban, human cloning ban, pain management and end of life care legislation all work together to restore the sanctity to innocent human life.

The successful lowering of abortion rates, through prolife legislation, validates the course the prolife movement has taken. Statistically speaking, fewer teens are aborting, more women are choosing life and abortion mills continue to close.

Ending abortion on demand remains the purpose of our organization. Even though obtaining that goal is still in the future, it is important to continue to limit abortion every way possible.

There are many who have fought on behalf of the unborn since 1973, when Roe vs. Wade and Doe vs. Bolton made unrestricted abortion every woman's "right". Regardless of the election outcome the prolife people in our country, no matter what their age or experience, will keep working to restore sanctity to human life. We will continue to be a voice for the unborn and frail.

## Plurality of Americans Want All or Most Abortions Illegal, Want Pro-Life Laws

A new Harris Poll finds a plurality of Americans want all or most abortions to be illegal and overwhelming majorities of Americans want more abortion limits in law. The nationwide poll showed just 9 percent said abortion should be legal for any reason at any time during pregnancy -- Barack Obama's position.

The Harris survey included 2,341 adults and was conducted December 10-12.

It found 82 percent of Americans said abortion should either be illegal under all circumstances or would limit its legality.

More specifically, 49 percent of those polled took a pro-life position wanting all abortions made illegal (11 percent) or wanting almost all abortions illegal except for very rare cases of saving the mothers life or in rape or incest (38 percent).

"These findings are remarkable," said Deirdre McQuade, who is the spokeswoman for the pro-life office of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, which sponsored the poll.

"Fewer than one in ten Americans support legal abortion for any reason at any time during pregnancy. But that is precisely the current state of abortion law under *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton*, the 1973 U.S. Supreme Court decisions that made abortion legal

throughout the nine months of pregnancy for virtually any reason," she told LifeNews.com.

The survey also found strong majorities of Americans support all of the common types of abortion limits enacted in Congress or state legislatures.

Some 95 percent of Americans say they favor laws ensuring only licensed physicians can do abortions.

Another 88 percent favor informed consent laws that provide women with information about abortion's risks and alternatives beforehand and 76 percent say they want laws that protect doctors and nurses from being forced to perform or refer for abortions against their will.

Some 73 percent of Americans in the Harris poll support parental involvement laws, 68 percent favor a ban on partial-birth abortion, and 63 percent favor bans on making taxpayers fund abortions.

"Support for these measures cuts across 'pro-life' and 'pro-choice' positions. Over a third (35 percent) of the small minority who said abortion should be legal for any reason throughout pregnancy nevertheless supported three or more of the six laws presented," McQuade said.

"These same widely-supported, constitutionally valid measures, some of

which have been proven effective in reducing abortion rates, are now seriously threatened by abortion advocates and their allies in Congress," McQuade said. "On behalf of children and their mothers, we will have to fight to keep such laws in place."

"This research indicates how out of touch pro-abortion groups are with mainstream America," McQuade added. "Pro-abortion groups have already sent a comprehensive 55-page blueprint for

## The Walk

Steven Curtis Chapman has a gift. He can deliver Bible truths to a beat. The Christian rocker has been doing it for years. Chapman's sound electrifies listeners with one number, then soothes them with the next. His lyrics are catchy and often inspiring. Chapman is at the top of his field, and he has five Grammy awards to prove it.

Chapman also has the wisdom to understand that talk, even talk put to music, is cheap. In *The Walk*, he asks whether he has lived as Jesus taught, whether he has answered God's holy call

to serve Him. "When the music stops, am I doing the Walk?" For Chapman, it's a matter of faith in action. Nothing else is as important. Or as Chapman puts it: "You can run with the big dogs, you can fly with the eagles, you can jump through all the hoops and climb the ladder to the top; but when it all comes down, you know it all comes down to the Walk."

On January 22 in Washington D.C., proliferators from across the country will literally and figuratively walk. They'll join forces in the March for Life, a march that sadly still must be made. This year's march marks the 36th anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, the Supreme Court decision

destroying our culture and country. Since *Roe*, we have legally killed almost 50 million unborn babies. Almost 200 sovereign lands aren't that populous. The abortion rate here is about 1.2 million annually, meaning that around *twelve human lives are destroyed every five minutes*. It's the American Holocaust, colored in blood red. Freedom for women? The hundreds, if not thousands, of women dead from legal abortion would surely say no.

The marchers figure to be even more determined this year because of another

their agenda to the incoming Administration,” McQuade told LifeNews.com. “But their agenda—including publicly-funded abortions, passage of the so-called ‘Freedom of Choice Act’ (FOCA), and attacking the Hyde amendment and other longstanding pro-life provisions in appropriations bills—won’t sell in the general public.”

“Most people agree we should work to reduce abortions, but you can’t reduce abortions by promoting abortion and eliminating all the policies that have proven effective in reducing abortions,” McQuade concluded.

D.C. walk just two days earlier. It's the inaugural parade ushering in the presidency of Barrack Obama. Though we are thankful for the peaceful transition of power, the transition will be anything but peaceful for the unborn. The president-elect has pledged himself to reversing pro-life gains, actions that will make him the most pro-abortion president in our history. By the time the pro-life walk steps off, the reversals will likely have already begun.

No church has been more outspoken in defense of the unborn than the Catholic Church, yet 54 percent of Catholics voted for our new president. What explains it? The economy? It's hard to believe that people put pocketbooks ahead of life. I'd like to think that it was due to the lack of national attention given to the abortion issue during the campaign. during Easter weekend in 1963, Dr. Martin Luther King penned a letter explaining to clergymen why he was protesting in Birmingham, Alabama. In a word, it was because of injustice. Citing the teachings of Sts. Augustine and Thomas Aquinas, King wrote that a just law is one that "squares with the moral law or law of God." An unjust law is the opposite. King told us that we have a "moral responsibility" to disobey unjust laws. It didn't matter to King that he was viewed as an extremist, for so were many great figures.

And the first on King's list was Jesus, an "extremist for love." Jesus walked from village to village seeing the injustices of life. He saw the Roman oppression of His people. He saw the oppression caused by misguided religious leaders who talked the truth but walked a different path. He saw the oppression caused by sin itself. He heard the cries of all, and He responded by sacrificial love. His life was a walk, and it led to the top of a hill. For us. He taught us the Walk.

Jesus didn't face legal abortion in His time here. He left that one for our walk. He calls us to see the unborn. He asks us to hear their cries. And He challenges us to resist the madness of legal abortion. Just as

we have a moral obligation to disobey unjust laws, we have a moral obligation to resist their enactment. Tell our new president about your opposition to his pro-abortion plans. Contact your federal and state representatives. Let them all know that you did not elect them to continue legal abortion and will walk away from them if they do. And walking with Jesus means that like Jesus, we must work to change hearts. Train your kids in the beauty of life and the horror of abortion. ## There Was a Life That Had to Be Cared For

"The human imagination can do many extraordinary things. But we can't imagine love. Or perhaps I mean loving: love as a continuous state; one that carries on in much the same way from day to day, changing and growing with time just as people do. The great stories of literature are about meeting and falling in love, about infidelity, about passion. They are seldom about the routines of married life and having children." -- From "I'm not a saint, just a parent" by Simon Barnes, London Times, November 13, 2006

For years I have been fascinated by an insight Philip Yancey, one of my favorite writers, borrowed from theologian H. Richard Niebuhr. I have shared it so often and in so many settings, it's odd that I did not think of using it in my role as editor of NRL News until last month.

Yancey writes, "Before its discovery [the Rosetta Stone] Egyptologists could only guess at the meaning of hieroglyphics. One unforgettable day, they uncovered a dark stone that rendered the same text in Greek, ordinary Egyptian script, and previously indecipherable hieroglyphics. By comparing translations side by side [since they knew Greek and ordinary Egyptian script], they mastered hieroglyphics and could now see clearly into a world they had known only in a fog."

To 98% of the American people, the abortion debate is like that. It is shrouded in a fog of conflicting claims and counter-claims. What can unlock the "secrets" to reveal to them who has the legitimate claim to their allegiance?

For those who honestly don't understand whether pro-lifers or pro-abortionists are right, what you might suggest to them is that they lay the conflicting claims side and side and use the way the two sides deal with the mother and child bond as the contemporary Rosetta Stone.

To pro-abortionists (on their best day), the unborn child is a appendage that can/ought to be cut off if "it" comes into existence at an inconvenient time. It's hard to miss the staggering irony.

Six days a week and twice on Sundays, pro-abortionists accuse pro-lifers of forgetting/ignoring/overlooking the woman. Yet it is they who treat the woman in isolation.

They are the ones who insist on viewing the unborn as if the child, unbeknownst to the mother, were a trunk that mysteriously made its way onto the ship. As mere luggage, rather than a real human being, the unborn child can be tossed overboard without compunction.

We recognize the moral (not to mention biological) poverty of seeing the mother as if she were a solo passenger. This means our task is much more difficult, but far more rewarding.

We care about both. We want both to reach safe harbor.

But there are other categories of powerless people who need our help: babies born with serious disabilities and the medically vulnerable elderly, to name two. If I could, let me briefly talk about babies who used to be called "Baby Does."

A prestigious British think tank not only is recommending limited (or no) treatment for premature babies, it also expressly took disability into account when formulating its heartless guidelines. But at least these children were allowed to be born.

The same kind of advanced technology that allows parents to view their bouncing baby boy in utero also affords them the hitherto secret knowledge that Johnny won't be perfect. Overwhelmingly, the sentence for daring to be imperfect is death.

Simon Barnes and his wife, Cindy, chose otherwise. In a remarkably powerful excerpt from a new book that appeared in mid-November in the London Times, Barnes wrote about his five-year-old son, Eddie, whom they knew before he joined them outside the womb had Down syndrome.

Barnes, the lead sports writer for the London Times, refuses to be "canonized."

The title of his piece is, "I'm not a saint, just a parent."

He is the first to admit how easily things could have turned out otherwise. Barnes writes, "At the hospital, when they discovered on the scan that Down's syndrome was a possibility, they very kindly offered to kill him for us."

Had he been married to someone other than Cindy, Barnes writes, "and had that woman preferred to go the way of amniocentesis and termination, I have no doubt that I would have gone along with that, too, and treated parents of Down's syndrome children with a lofty pity."

But "They needn't have bothered," he writes. "The idea of not caring for something in your care is an abomination to her. The idea of not caring for her own child was impossible to contemplate. Amniocentesis? Not a chance, it puts the child at risk. And no matter what such a test would say about the child, she would go ahead. There was a life that had to be cared for."

"There was a life that had to be cared for." Not a bad motto for the Pro-Life Movement.

There will be occasions in the future when people who have formed no alliances will, in essence, throw up their hands in frustration. They will lament, "Who is right?" These situations should be seen for what they are: golden opportunities.

Your answer will be simple. You will ask them to consider which side refuses to choose death over life, refuses to puzzle over elementary human biology as if it were written in Sanskrit, would be incredulous if you suggested they could abandon their own, and refuses to give into despair.

I'll take our chances, won't you?

## Planned Parenthood Abortion Funding Requests in Obama Memo Top \$4.6 Billion

The abortion funding would also include \$65 million for the UNFPA, the United Nations

Washington, DC (LifeNews.com) -- Planned Parenthood and dozens of other abortion advocacy groups presented their wish list to incoming President Barack Obama in a secret memo last week that wound up published on the transition team web site. In the memo the nation's largest abortion business requested \$4.6 billion in taxpayer funding for abortion and other efforts.

Jim Sedlack, the president of STOPP International, a Planned Parenthood watchdog group, compiled the total amounts of funding requested in the memo and said he was shocked by the amount.

When reading Planned Parenthood's plan for the Obama administration, we were struck by the massive amounts of money it would take to implement it," Sedlack told LifeNews.com. "Especially in this time of economic hardship, it is particularly galling that PP would seek to further fatten its coffers at the expense of the American public."

Sedlack said he added up the costs of the programs and funding requested and estimated the amounts not contained in the memo and reports that "it is clear that funding the entire package put together by Planed Parenthood would cost the American taxpayer \$4.6 billion -- most of it in annual expenditures."

Much of the funding would come in the form of increases in federal budget allotments -- ranging from a \$300-700 million increase in the Title X family planning program to \$540 million more in the Medicaid-funded family planning services program to \$267 million to increase funding for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's STD Prevention Program.

Other high-priced goodies Planned Parenthood requested from Obama include \$120 million for abortions by striking some of the current budget restrictions that prevent taxpayers from being forced to pay for abortions except in very limited circumstances.

population agency that has been involved in the China program limiting couples to one child and forcing them to have abortions or sterilizations when they don't comply. Planned Parenthood also wants Obama to give the pro-abortion agency another \$50 million in back payments.

Planned Parenthood also wants \$50 million for sexual education programs, \$66 million for school-based sexual education programs, \$850 million more of the Title V maternal and child health program, and as much as \$935 million for international family planning programs.
